The level of flexibility and adaptation evident in this company has persisted through the untimely deaths of family members, the move across the Atlantic, wars, fires, political turmoil, and the Great Depression, and has led it to invent new models of cymbals for use in religious feasts, prayers, royal weddings, military bands, and symphonies—all while sticking together as the Zildjian cymbal family. This suggests that both the continuity of a firm's name and the family involvement in the enterprise are necessary conditions for the longevity of a family firm. Let's pause to capture some of the basics about your family and its enterprise.
